# Code of Conduct

# SECTION A: INTRODUCTION

This document constitutes the Code of Conduct of Aerorand Primary School as approved by the School Governing Body in January of 2023. The Code of Conduct is drafted in accordance with the relevant terms and conditions of the Constitution of The Republic of South Africa (Act. 108 of 1996), South African Schools Act 84 of 1996, National Education Policy Act 27 of 1996, Guidelines for the Code of Conduct for Learners (General Notice 776 of the Government Gazette 18900 of 15 May 1998).

### SECTION B: GENERAL PRINCIPLES OF VALUE

#### SECTION C: OBJECTIVES OF SCHOOL RULES

The School Rules are made to ensure the values mentioned above and to teach learners a positive value system with regard to principles such as respect, co-operation, consideration, and tolerance and to strengthen it. To teach learners to accept authority and to function in an orderly manner so that they may develop into responsible and disciplined adults. To encourage learners to participate in sports and cultural activities in order to assist them in developing physical and mental strength and to foster goodwill and a healthy way of life.

# SECTION D: SCHOOL RULES

#### 1. GOOD BEHABIOUR TOWARDS TEACHERS, STAFF AND PREFECTS.

Learners will:

- 1.1 Obey and carry out all instructions which have been issued.
- 1.2 At all times behave in a friendly and respectful manner.
- 1.3 Not use any form of violence or damage against any person or property.
- 1.4 When in school uniform, be properly dressed-according to the dress code, and will behave respectably at all times.
- 1.5 Not act in any dishonest way, lie or be deceitful.
- 1.6 Follow the school rules and accept the punishment according to this Code of Conduct.
- 1.7 Not be absent from any detention / disciplinary hearing without a proper excuse.

#### SMOKING/ALCOHOL/OTHER DRUGS

- 2.1 No learner may, at any time, smoke or have any cigarettes, "Vape" or "hubbly-bubbly" or sell these items.
- 2.2 No learner may, at any time, drink, use or sell any alcohol, benzine or any other "drugs".
- 2.3 No learner will, at any time, enter the school grounds under the influence of any illegal substances and must submit to random testing.
- 2.4 No learner may give any illegal substances to other learners or persons, at any time.

2.5 At any time, the devices or substances mentioned above will be confiscated as evidence. A reasonable body search as well as a search through possessions to confiscate any device or piece of equipment that looks suspicious may be carried out by a member or the SMT.

#### 3. SEXUALLY OFFENSIVE MATERIAL

- 3.1 No learner will be allowed to, at any time:
- 3.1.1 Draw pictures/words, write notes or letters of a sexual nature at school.
- 3.1.2 Bring or share any sexual materials or devices at school whether physical or digital.
- 3.1.3 Bully or embarrass any person regarding their sexual orientation at school.
- 3.1.4 At any time, the materials mentioned above will be confiscated as evidence. A reasonable body search as well as a search through possessions to confiscate any piece of material that looks suspicious may be carried out by a member or the SMT.

#### 4. SCHOOL ATTENDANCE & ASSESSMENT

- 4.1 A learner must be at school on every school day for the whole of the school day and be on time.
- 4.2 A learner is not allowed to be absent from a lesson or leave the school grounds without permission from a member of the SMT.
- 4.3 When a learner is absent from school the learner MUST present a docter's note, funeral notice or any other proof for being absent.
- 4.4 Learners MUST be at school by 7:20am when gates are locked. If a learner has been late 3 times, a fine of R200 will be added to their school account. When arriving late, learners MUST be signed in at the front office, before they may go to class.
- 4.6 According to the National Policy of Assessment If a learner is absent during an examination/assessment the same rules will apply. No learner will be allowed to write the paper at another time. If there is no proof for the absence they will get zero (0) for the exam/assessment.
- 4.7 The rules above will also apply to sport practices and events. A docter's note MUST be handed in for absence at least 2 days before a match so the coach can make arrangements.
- 4.8 Parents may not drop-off any items at the front office, including lunchboxes, sporting equipment, medicine, projects or items for assessment tasks, money or permission slips. We refer to the Core Values of the school in teaching our learners accountability, responsibility and diligence from a young age.

#### 5. SPORTS

- 5.1 All learners are expected to participate in sport practises for at least 1 sport per term.
- 5.2 Only medical reasons, with proof from a medical practitioner will be accepted as a valid excuse.

#### 6. SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND OTHER AMENITIES

- 6.1 No learner will:
  - 6.1.1 Be allowed to enter the school buildings before school.
  - 6.1.2 Be allowed to run or race to the classrooms when entering the schoolgrounds for their own safety and to prevent injuries.
  - 6.1.3 Be allowed to walk or play in the parking lot at any time.
  - 6.1.4 Be allowed to gather on the zebra-crossing inside the schoolgrounds when entering the schoolgrounds.
  - 6.1.5 Be in classrooms during breaks or after school without permission.
  - 6.1.6 Enter any office, the staffroom, photo-copy room, or storerooms without permission.
  - 6.1.7 Be in the front office during normal school hours, except with permission.
  - 6.1.8 Break or damage any school building, fence, desk, toilet, windows or any property of the school or teachers.
  - 6.1.9 Drive or allow anyone else to drive any vehicle belonging to the school without permission.
  - 6.1.10 Use any equipment or sports fields, playground of the school after school hours.
  - 6.1.11 Play during or disrupt the Assembly period.
  - 6.1.12 Play in the bus/transport or distract the driver while travelling to or from sporting events.

#### 6.2 Every learner will:

- 6.2.1 Keep the school clean and neat. It is every learner's responsibility to pick up papers and clean-up the playground, classrooms and bathroom which they use.
- 6.2.2 Behave according to the school rules while on any outing or tour.

#### 7. VIOLENCE, MEAN BEHAVIOUR AND TRANSPORT

#### 7.1 No learner, at any time:

- 7.1.1 Use foul language, swear words, abusive language or hand signs to bully or embarrass another person.
- 7.1.2 Use any form of violence, physical, verbal, emotional, digital, fighting, daring, "dissing", "roasting", intimidating, threatening or victimizing any other person.
- 7.1.3 Either use or distribute any type of explosive, including fireworks, firearms, ammunition, knives, scissors, combs, or flammable product like sanitizer any toy that may cause bodily harm or have it in his/her possession.
- 7.1.4 At any time, the materials mentioned above will be confiscated as evidence. A reasonable body search as well as a search through possessions to confiscate any piece of material that looks suspicious may be carried out by a member or the SMT.
- 7.1.4 Commit any form of racism. LGBTQ+ discrimination or sexual activity with, to or in view of another person.

#### 7.2 No learner shall:

- 7.2.1 Use skateboards or roller blades on any part of the school grounds including the school buildings.
- 7.2.2 Ride any kind of bicycle on the school grounds or in any part of the school buildings.
- 7.2.3 Drive a motor vehicle on any part of the school grounds.
- 7.2.4 Ride a motorbike, scooter, or guad bike on any part of the school grounds.
- 7.2.5 Park his/her bicycle on any other place other than in the cycle racks or designated area.
- 7.2.6 Take, borrow, use or steal any property of any person without their permission.
- 7.2.7 Litter or leave any trash in any part of the building but use the dustbins provided.
- 7.2.8 Play outside the school grounds or in the gardens in front of the office building.
- 7.2.9 Throw stones in any part of the schoolgrounds or play rough fighting/ wrestling games.
- 7.2.10 Climb over fences or hedges in any part of the school grounds: Climb into trees or swing from tree branches: Climb onto any roof for any reason whatsoever.
- 7.2.11 Pick any flowers or damage any plant or shrubs on the school grounds,
- 7.2.12 Use any cell phone. MP3 player, i-Pod, tablet, Smart-watch, USB speaker or radio on the school arounds.
  - 7.2.12.1 Any device as mentioned in 7.2.12 must, on entering the premises, be locked away in the register class storeroom and remain there until the end of the school day: or be handed into the office for safekeeping.
- 7.2.13 Take or make a video of any teacher, classroom, school activity or other learner at any time, on or off the schoolgrounds. Such video material made available through social media will be used as evidence in a disciplinary hearing as a violation of the POPIA act.
- 7.2.14 Hitchhike while wearing school uniform.
- 7.3. Any conviction by a court of law on any charge may lead to a disciplinary hearing and possible further disciplinary action against the learner.
- 7.4 At any time, the materials mentioned above will be confiscated as evidence. A reasonable body search as well as a search through possessions to confiscate any piece of material that looks suspicious may be carried out by a member or the SMT.

#### 8. CLASSROOM AND EXAMINATION ROOM

- In the classroom or examination room a learner will:
- 8.1 Always show respect towards teachers, staff, prefects and other learners.
- 8.2 Carry out all instructions regarding schoolwork, homework, tests, and examinations.
- 8.3 Act responsibly and supportively towards other persons.
- 8.4 Not in any way, through bad behaviour, deprive themselves or fellow learners the right to education or test-and examination facilities
- 8.5 Not eat or drink in the classroom or chew gum or any other object including paper, pens. pen-caps. sticks, plastic or clothing.
- 8.6 Not throw any objects across the room, like scissors, erasers, pencils or lunch boxes.
- 8.7 Complete all work and homework neatly and hand in on time. No homework may be copied From anybody else. This excludes learners who were absent. Such homework may be copied and completed responsibly.

8.8 Not cheat, copy or talk during an assessment or examination.

#### 9. ROTATION OF CLASSES Learners will:

- 9.1 Behave in an orderly way when forming lines and moving between classes. NO RUNNING!
- 9.2 Move guickly, orderly, and guietly when changing classes.
- 9.3 At the beginning of break take their bags to the classroom they will line up for after break.
- 9.4 Not leave any personal possessions or bags in the front office during and after school or during breaks.



#### SECTION E: DISCIPLINARY MATTERS GRADE 1-7 DISCIPLINARY SYSTEM DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE

- Learner Support files are used with the Learner Behavioural file.
- There will be one Behavioural file in each register class containing the necessary documents.
- At the end of the year these forms are taken out of the Behavioural file and put into the Learner Support file.
- If a learner has accumulated 10 demerits the register teacher will fill in a green slip as a warning. If a learner has accumulated 20 demerits the register teacher will fill in a red slip for the learner to sit detention.

#### DISCIPLINARY MEASURES

#### DEMERITS WHEN GUILTY OF AN OFFENCE

Learners found guilty of transgressing any of the prohibitions of this Code of Conduct will be punished according to the empowerment given to the SGB or the Principal or his/her delegates. Serious transgressions may result in expulsion or suspension and will be handled according to the procedure in paragraph 3.

- 2.1 According to the Schools Act (Act 84 of 1996) "suspension" and "expulsion" is described as follows:
  - 2.1.1 "Suspension" means the Principal and/or SGB may, in accordance with the Schools Act, suspend a learner for a period of 5 school days at onetime in which he/she will not be allowed to attend school.
  - 2.1.2 "Expulsion" means the learner is permanently expelled from attending this school and this power is vested in the Head of Education in the Province.

#### EXAMPLE OF SERIOUS MISBEHAVIOUR

The following examples of serious misbehaviour may lead to suspension or expulsion:

- 2.2.1 Gross rudeness or similar behaviour.
- 2.2.2 The possession, threat or use of a dangerous weapon that endangers the safety of others.
- 2.2.3 Be under the influence of, or be in possession of, or use, hand over or trade in drugs or alcohol.
- 2.2.4 Fighting, physical assault, throwing rocks/ stones to others or blasphemy.
- 2.2.5 Fraud, lying or dishonesty.
- 2.2.6 Hate speech, sexism, sexual harassment, immoral behaviour, cyber bullying or racism.
- 2.2.7 Theft or in possession of stolen property.
- 2.2.8 Vandalism or graffiti .
- 2.2.9 Violence or threat towards learners or teachers.
- 2.2.10 Frequent disruptive misbehaviour.

- 2.2.11 Specific behaviour in or outside the school context which, as a result of the seriousness thereof, may lead to be found guilty in a court of law.
- 2.2.12 Intimidation or victimisation in any form.
- 2.2.13 Cheating in tests or examinations.
- 2.2.14 Serious threatening or disruption of the learning process.
- 2.2.15 Defamation or violation of the dignity of a teacher, the school as a learning institution or any other person.(bad mouthing)

2.2.16 Be in possession, manufacture or distribute any indecent or offensive material.

- 2.2.17 Under the influence of alcohol or forbidden substances during a school function on the school grounds or not.
- 2.2.18 Repeatedly absent from school or lessons.

#### 3. PROCEDURE FOR EXPULSION AND/OR SUSPENSION OF LEARNERS

- 3.1. If the attention of the SGB is drawn to the fact that a learner is misbehaving to such an extent that it will have a detrimental effect on the school and the learner if there is no disciplinary action taken, the SGB must: (120+demerits)
  - 3.1.1. Inform the learner and his/her parents or guardians of the misconduct and the anticipated action. This notification will put the case in the form of a formal charge and will explain their rights and the procedures.
  - 3.1.2. A meeting by a committee of the SGB in the form of a Disciplinary Hearing will be called whereby the learner, his/her parents or guardians or an official delegate on behalf of them, will be given the opportunity to, either verbally or in writing, submit recommendations because the learner should not be suspended or expelled.
- 3.2. After all the relevant arguments and witnesses are heard, the committee will decide whether to suspend the learner for more than 5 school days or recommend to the Head of Education of the Province to expel the learner permanently from the school.
- 3.3. When the SGB recommends that a learner must be expelled from the school permanently, the accused is not allowed to attend the school while waiting for the outcome; and
- 3.4. When the SGB decides to suspend a learner or recommends to the Head of Education to expel a learner, the parents or guardians of the learner will be notified in writing and all reasons will be given in detail.
- 3.5 Any sanction handed down by an SGB Disciplinary Hearing must be viewed in a very serious light. Any sanction given must be completed within the time frame indicated by the SGB. This time frame will be indicted in writing. Failure to abide by the sanction within the time frame stipulated, without a valid reason provided to the principal, will result in automatic suspension of the learner. This suspension will remain in place until a further SGB Disciplinary Hearing has been held. Every attempt will be made to hold the further SGB Disciplinary Hearing within five school days.

#### 4. EXCLUSION FROM SOCIAL ACTIVITIES AND THE DEMERIT SYSTEM

- 4.1. Over and above punishment such as suspension or expulsion, the principal or her delegate has the power to exclude a learner who has more than 80 demerits from attending and/or partaking in social activities.
- 4.2. A Grade 7 learner with more than 100 demerits will not be allowed to attend the Grade 7 farewell.
- 4.3. School prefects will be subject to the Prefect Code of Conduct of 2024.

**MERIT & DEMERIT SYSTEM** The disciplinary system aims to discipline learners in a positive way. It helps with the identification of certain behavioural patterns and to keep a record of a learners' conduct.
